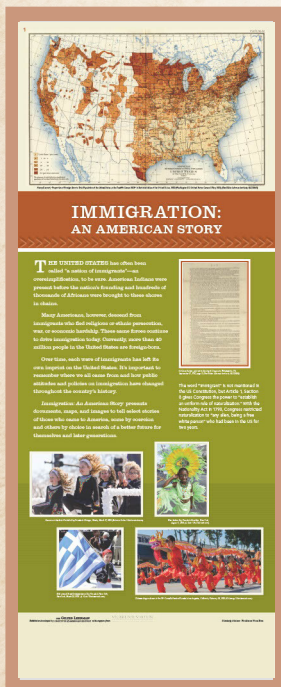
### *Who can book these exhibits:*

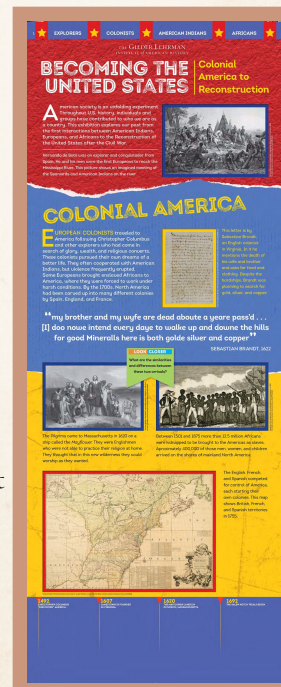

Many Americans are descendants of those who sought refuge from persecution, war, or economic hardship. “Immigration: An American Story” showcases documents, maps, and images that illustrate the diverse experiences of immigrants, highlighting their search for a better future.
